





| Christ | Anointed One, Messiah | Chi Rho (on all Cotter stuff) |
| Pentecost | Beginning of the Church when the Holy Spirit filled the apostles and Mary, Jesus' mom |  |
| epistle | Greek for letter. Think of the New Testament letters. |  |
| Eucharist | Also called the Mass or Lord's Supper, and based on a word for "thanksgiving," it is the central Christian liturgical celebration, established by Jesus at the Last Supper. |  |
| Domestic Church | Another name for the first and most fundamental community of faith: the family. |  |
| doctrine | An official, authoritative teaching of the Church based on the Revelation of God | |
| dogma | a principle or set of principles laid down by an authority as incontrovertibly true.: "the Christian dogma of the Trinity" (online dictionary source) |  |

| <p>vocation</p> | <p>Teachings recognized as central to Church teaching, defined by the Magisterium and accorded the fullest weight and authority. A call from God to all members of the Church to embrace a life of holiness. | <p>Ecumenical Council</p> | <p>A gathering of the Church's bishops from around the world convened by the Pope or approved by him to address pressing issues in the Church.</p> |  |
| <p>sacrament</p> | <p>An outward, visible sign of God's grace. The Roman Catholic Church celebrates 7 of these</p> |  |
| <p>Holy Orders</p> | <p>The Sacrament by which members of the Church are ordained for permanent ministry in the Church as bishops, priests, or deacons</p> |  |
| <p>Marriage</p> | <p>Sacrament of life long commitment to married life</p> |  |
| <p>Confirmation</p> | <p>Sacrament of initiation (set up at Pentecost)</p> |  |
